### 2. How long are your data stored? (In Addition to Hannover Re's Group DPCS)

We erase your personal application data twenty-four months automatically after the conclusion of an ongoing application process, i.e. after receipt of a rejection, discontinuation of the application process or contract offer. This does not apply if legal provisions prevent erasure or further storage is necessary for evidentiary purposes or if you have consented to longer storage.

If you do not delete your personal account in the Hannover Re application portal, your personal data will remain stored in your application profile for twenty-four months from the last change or activity, provided your application status is active. This means that you can use it for the next six months for further applications to Hannover Re. If you neither change your data nor apply for another position at Hannover Re within these twenty-four months and your application status is active, your application profile will be automatically deleted after twenty-four months in addition to your personal account in the portal. In this case, only anonymised data will remain on the portal.
